Sealants are an everyday procedure in most general and pediatric dental offices. However, many of them are placed without removing plaque from occlusal grooves and fissures. Also, most dentists use sealant materials which have high polymerization shrinkage and wear significantly during service. This video presents several methods to reduce the premature failure of the reported 50% of sealants at 5 years of service, demonstrates the suggested techniques, and makes practice management suggestions for sealants and preventive resin restorations.
